Within Your embrace.


BE FREEby Karen Elliott

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In the vision, I saw feet dancing whilst the drumming of our worship was going on. I saw many feet dancing (like what you'd see at a powwow if you were sitting on the ground). I also saw the mallet, with a red end/top, that was being used to beat a hand held drum. (In my heart, I was questioning who's feet they were, belonging to Christians or... non-Christians. I had a sense that intermingled with the Christians were those who stood against God's Kingdom, though futile it is as the Lord reigns over all.)

Then, I saw Jesus rolling out "Carpets of Truth". I saw huge rolls of what looked like sod grass rolled up like a giant sized roll of carpet, the width of a path, with the capital letters T-R-U-T-H just above them, as He rolled them out, so people would be able to walk the path of Truth.

Then, I saw Him (Jesus) on one of the highest points—with like a barrel (or sepulchre) that was filled with His blood. Sons and Orphans

When Adam sinned he did two things indicating he had changed his mindset from being a son (see Luke 3:38) to becoming an orphan. Before he sinned he had walked with his Father in the cool of the day. He had enjoyed his Father; now he viewed his Father as an enemy. This is evident because he hid from his Father and he clothed himself. He no longer had confidence that the Father loved him and he was no longer happy with the way he looked.

Adam was afraid of the God who is perfect love; who created man in His image and was later to send His only Son to redeem man to Himself. Adam now felt he was unworthy to fellowship with his Father so he hid and made clothes for himself trying to prove he was now worthy.

When Adam hid he became an orphan. When anyone looses or dismisses his father he is no longer a member of the family but an orphan who does not have a family. Please note God did not abandon or get angry with Adam, in fact, He came to the garden and called to Adam; "Where are you?" God knew Adam had sinned (He knows the end from the beginning) but He came looking for him anyway.

God did not abandon Adam, and continued to speak to him as the pages of Scripture reveal (see Genesis 3). Now the whole of their relationship changed from being a son and walking with his Father in the garden to being an orphan who wanted to hide from God.

So it is with us today. We are told "God loves us", but when the pressure is on, we do not really believe this. We are told to talk to God, however, when we do, we come as an unworthy beggar trying to convince God that He should do what we ask. Many times we feel so unworthy we forget to ask for anything.

We feel like the prodigal son who said in Luke 15:18-20:

An orphan feels unworthy and unloved, he feels like a hired man. Deep down, he knows the Father does not really love him. He is aware of the multiple sins he has committed and the extreme difficulty to be free of those sins. Some of us have attended recovery groups for years and are not sure we can be forgiven. We have had accountability partners or an accountability group and have confessed our sins each week with little or no progress. We have gone through deliverance and had seven devils cast out but we still feel the same as before.

An orphan also knows he must provide for himself. Adam introduced this to us by making clothing to cover his nakedness (see Genesis 3:6). Later on, God made clothes for Adam and Eve to replace the fig leaves with the skins of animals (see Genesis 3:21). God sacrificed animals because He continued to love man.

Since an orphan knows he must provide for himself, he becomes a hoarder. He has a house full of stuff; "just in case". He now rents a storage unit to house all his back issues of National Geographic because you never know when you might want them. Probably his hard-drive is full as well. A recent series of programs on A&E is entitled "The Hoarders", and shows houses so full of stuff it is hard to find a place to sit or sleep.

An orphan is usually competitive, always telling you he got a better deal or can beat you at any game. He is anxious to get a better job or position. He is not satisfied with the amount of money he has and always wants a better car, house or boat. He feels unfulfilled and is frustrated that he never seems to get fulfilled in his dream in the Lord.

No one can correct an orphan. He is most often angry and will keep you away for fear he will explode if you get too close. He sees any attempt to correct him as rejection of him.

We were all born into Adam. In other words we were born an orphan. Some of us had a wonderful loving natural father, but most of us did not. A good relationship with a natural father certainly gives us a great advantage of knowing and understanding The Heavenly Father.

Jesus said; "I will not leave you as orphans". In other words He will not leave us as He found us. He wants us to know and experience His love and humility. He is desirous of building us (the corporate man) into a holy nation. He created man in His image and His likeness. He is in the process of conforming us into the image and likeness of Jesus Christ. This conforming is not something that will take place in the millennium but on earth as it is in heaven, right now.

A son thinks differently than an orphan. He knows the Father loves him and wants the best for him. A son is one who is in the process of giving up his right to run, hide and shift blame. He has given up the right to himself. He chooses to identify with God's interests in other people.

He has taken the position of humility. He does not have to vindicate himself and is not upset when other people get recognition. He is correctable. In fact he presents his thoughts and ideas to his spiritual father and receives correction and encouragement. Jesus humbled Himself and became obedient, even unto death.

The Sermon on the Mount is no longer a poetic metaphor but a grand experiment in the life of a son as he is being conformed to the image of Jesus. He has not the slightest trace of resentment even suppressed in his heart.

Death is no longer a threat. A son has already died; No one can threaten him with a gun to his head. An orphan will respond with fear when someone puts a gun to his head but a son will not be dissuaded to change his mind.

A mature son is not interested in gaining power by political means. He knows he is a citizen of another nation who's maker and ruler is God. He is neither a democrat nor republican. He does not pray against anything, including unpopular or immoral political leaders. He is not upset by "Special Interest Groups" who support issues that are "not Christian".

He is not a pacifist but a son of God. He is not worried about events in Israel or the Middle East. He is not "anti-church" but allows the love of God to be expressed in his life to all people. He feels comfortable with people of all nationalities and races; in fact, he learns to draw on their strengths and insights. He is not concerned with the Anti-Christ or the demonic principalities over a geographic region of the country.

He (or she) is a son; celebrating his sonship with a spiritual father and the family of God. His celebration results in a joy and peace that passes his understanding. As a result, people are drawn to him and his spiritual family. People recognize the humility and love of this group and want to be a part of it.

Isa 2:2-4

- ² In the last days, the mountain of the LORD's house will be the highest of all—the most important place on earth. It will be raised above the other hills, and people from all over the world will stream there to worship.
- ³ People from many nations will come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of Jacob's God. There he will teach us his ways, and we will walk in his paths." For the LORD's teaching will go out from Zion; his word will go out from Jerusalem.
- ⁴ The LORD will mediate between nations and will settle international disputes. They will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will no longer fight against nation, nor train for war anymore. NLT

These are the "Last Days" in which God is turning the hearts of the fathers to the children and the children to the fathers. He is establishing His Holy Nation above all the other nations. God is putting His sons on display giving them the glory that is rightfully theirs.

He intends to put us on display so all the other nations will see us and come to find what makes us so joyous. It will be so evident that many orphans will come and ask us to "teach them our ways". They will know their ways do not work and we offer a superior alternative.

God is changing us, so others will be drawn to us. We do not have to go and find them, they will come to us. We do not have to pray them in or do battle in the heavenlies for their salvation. They will pray to find us and God will connect us.

They will come as orphans and our influence will make them sons of God. They will join us in the body of Christ, taking their place and glorifying God.

Let us choose the way of the Lord. He has called us as sons. Our response should be; "Yes Lord"!
